

Work-related diseases


- 4-8% of cancers due to occupational exposure
- Work place stress, musculoskeletal disorders


Demographic change

Percentage of workers in education in microworkplaces – 20%


Education sector workplaces visited by labour inspectorate 38%

Percentage workers in education 50 years and over: 33%


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Risk factors in work establishments (ESENER II)



Risk assessment carried out by sector (ESENER II)




Why no risk assessment? (ESENER II)




Health and safety discussed by management? (ESENER II)


Health and safety issues discusses at the top level of management, regularly, by activity sector (% establishments in the EU-28).
